Introduction

The International Committee Against Execution (ICAE) has put together a list of some of those killed by the Islamic regime of Iran's forces during the recent protests in Iran. The government has admitted to 27 dead in Tehran during the protests but the real numbers are much higher.

According to the received reports, IRI's military forces were referring to the hospitals and the everywhere else that may keeping the injured and killed people and forcible abducted them and in many cases were graved killed people secretly.

The ICAE has been able to identify only the names of 114 of those killed during the recent protests. The ICAE

is still trying to find more details and information to complete the list. The ICAE calls to all to send in any relevant information.

- 1 - Funerary ceremony should be done quietly and only with the close family.
- 2 - in the Funerary ceremony nobody should do speeches or slogans and propaganda against the government.
- 3 - Not to write anything on how they died in the ceremony and on the gravestone.

IRI's agents have done an extensive effort to prevent the public on names and photos of victims. They put pressure on the families of victims in order to cover their crime committed

and tray to make unaware the Iranian people and the world and human rights organizations on it.

Despite the threats and pressures of IRI's agents, we provide these identified victims names with the efforts and assistance of the victims' families and political and human rights activists inside or outside of Iran.

Those killed by the Islamic regime of Iran

1- Neda Agha Soltan (pictured left), a 27-year-old student, was shot by the Baseej at a demonstration in Tehran on 20 June, 2009. In inter-



views with the press, her fiancé, Caspian Makan, said 'Neda was never supportive of either group [referring to the factions in the regime]. She wanted freedom; Freedom for everyone.' Her murder has become a symbol of resistance.

2- Ashkan Sohrabi (pictured left) ,a 20-year-old, was killed by the Islamic regime of Iran on June 20. He was shot thrice in the chest and died on the way to the hospital. He has been buried in Behesht e

Zahra cemetery section 257, row 50, number 19.



3- Bahman Jenabi (pictured left), a 19-year-old, was killed downtown Tehran on June 20. He was working in a shop that installed and repaired central heating systems. According to the witnesses, he was shot and killed by Baseej forces during the protests against the Islamic Republic of Iran.



4- Hossein Tahmasebi, a 25-year-old, was beaten to death by the re-

gime's Baseej forces on June 15 on No-Bahar St. in Kermanshah. A friend of Hossein's was quoted as saying:



'Hossein supported neither candidates and did not vote. He came to streets to protest against the suppression and despotism of the Islamic Republic.' Hundreds of people were witness to Hossein's murder.



5- Kianoosh Asa (pictured left), a Chemistry student, was abducted from the Majidieh dormi-

tory of the University of Science and Technology in Tehran on June 15. His body was found in a morgue 10 days later, bearing signs of torture.

6- Mehdi Karami (pictured left) was shot in the neck in Jonnat Abad Street, Tehran on 15 June.



7- Mostafa Ghanian (pictured left). A Tehran university graduate, was killed during the attack on Tehran University dormitories on the night of 14 June 2009. His body was buried in his home town in Mashhad on 21 June 2009. A picture of his dead body reveals he was brutally attacked with an axe.



8- Naser Amirnejad, Aerospace PHD student, was killed by a shot fired from the Baseej building in Tehran. His body was buried in his home town, one of the villages in the city of Yasouj on 19th June 2009.



9- Mohammad Hossein Barzegar, a self-employed 25-year-old, died of a shot to his head on 17th June at the 7 Tir Square and was buried on 21st June.

10- Seyed Reza Tabatabaei, a 30-year-old accountant, was shot in

the head on June 20th at Azerbaijan Street and was buried on 24th June.

11 - Iman Hashemi, a self-employed 27-year-old, was shot in the eye and killed on 20th June on Azadi street.

12 – Parisa Kali. A 25-year-old literature graduate, was shot in the neck on 21st June in Keshavarz Blvd and buried on 24th June.

13 - Mohsen Haddadi, a 24-year-old IT designer, was killed on 20th June due to the shot in the head in Nosrat Street.

14 - Mohammad Nikzady, a 22-year-old graduate, was shot in the chest on 16th June in Vanak Square.

15 - Ali Shahedi, a 24-year-old, died in custody at Tehran-Pars police station after his arrest on 21st June. The reason for his death has been recorded as unknown, however, his family believe it was as a result of torture.

16 - Vahed Akbari, a 34-year-old, was married with a 3-year-old daughter,. He was shot in the side and died on 20th June.

17 – Abolfazl Abdollahi. A 21-year-old, was shot in the back in front of Sharif University of Technology on 20th June.

18 - Salar Tahmasebi, a 27-year-old Business student, was shot in the head on 20th June on Jomhuri Street.

19 – Famimeh Salahshoor, a 25-year-old, was brutally beaten in Vali Asr St. in Tehran. She died in hospital on 15th June.

20 - Vahid Reza Tabatabaei, a 29-

year-old English graduate, was shot in the head in Baharestan and killed on 24th June.

21 - Farzad Jashni, from Abdana, Ilam town. He was working in Tehran. He was killed by security forces. His body was buried in his home town on 19th June.

22 - Shelyr Khezri, a 23-year-old student, was killed in Tehran on 16th June when security forces attacked Tehran University. Her body was buried in her home town Piranshahr.

23 - Yaqub Barvayeh, a post graduate student of Art and Architecture School of Tehran University was shot by Baseej forces from Lolagar mosque rooftop on 25th June and transferred to Locoman hospital but He died in hospital. Security agents transferred Yaqub's body to an unknown place and after 48 hours informed his family that his body has been buried.



24 - Kaveh Alipour, a 19-year-old, was killed on 20th June in Tehran. According to The Wall Street Journal the government demanded an equivalent of \$3000 to return his body to his family.

25 - Saeed Abbasi, a 24-year-old, a shop assistant in a shoe shop, was killed on 20th June in Rudaki Street in Tehran. Footage of his bloodied body can be seen

26 – Mobina Ehterami, a Tehran University student, was killed when the regime's forces attacked the dormitory in the evening 14th June.

27 - Fatemeh Barati was killed when the regime's forces attacked the dormitory in the evening of 14th June. Her body has been buried in Behesht-e-Zahra cemetery without her family's knowledge.

28 – Kasry Sharafi was killed when the regime's forces attacked the dormitory in the evening of 14th June. His body has been buried in Behesht-e-Zahra cemetery without his family's knowledge.

29 - Kambiz Shoaie was killed when the regime's forces attacked the dormitory in the evening 14 June. His body has been buried in Behesht-e-Zahra cemetery without his family's knowledge.

30 - Mohsen Imani, was killed when the regime's forces attacked the dormitory in the evening 14 June. His body has been buried in Behesht-e-Zahra cemetery without his family's knowledge.

31 – Fatemeh Rajabpour, a 38-year-old, was shot dead along with her mother, Sorour Boroumand, at the protests on 15th June in Mohammad Ali Jenah Road. Her father said: 'They shot my wife and daughter in the side and throat; when I reached them they were both soaked in blood.'

32 – Soroor Boroumand, a 58-year-old, was shot dead with her daughter on 15th June on Mohammad Ali Jenah Road. See above.

33- Alireza eftekhari, Aged 29, Journalist. He worked for Abrar Economy, a newspaper owned by the Abrar publishing house, for five



years, leaving in 2008. He died on 15 June. The exact circumstances of his death are still not known but we have been told he died as result of a cerebral attack after being beaten.

34 - Ahmad Naeem Abadi was shot dead by the Ashoora Battalion 117 in Azadi Square. His body was handed over to his family on 21st June.



35 - Nader Nasseri, was killed on 20th June in Khoosh Road and was buried in Babol.

36 - Masoud Khosravi was killed on 15th June in Azadi Square. he lived in Sattar Khan, Tehran. His family was not given permission to bury him in Tehran and they were forced to bury Masoud in her mother's hometown Vali Abad Village – Khshk Bijar – in Gilan province.

37 – Iman Namazie was killed on 15th Jun at the Tehran University dormitory attack.

38- Masoud Hashemzadeh, was killed on 20th June



39 – Salar Qorbani Param. 22, was killed in the post-election demonstrations. The authorities stated the cause of his death as "accident". His father has a clothing shop in Enqelab Square next to Refah Bank. The family held his wake

in Mirdamad.

40 - Hossein Toofan Pour. 32, was detained on 30th Khor-dad. According to eye witnesses he was so badly beaten that his arm was obviously broken and then he was shot in the head. He is registered as buried in Behesht-e-Zahra Block 233. Reportedly his family was asked to pay US\$ 2,4000.00 if they wish to collect Hossein's body. His family refused to pay the regime any money for killing their son.



41 - Tina Soodi. A student, was shot dead on 30th Khordad in Enqelab Square. Her family was ordered to say that she died of natural causes if they wanted to receive her body.

42 - Hossein Akhtar Zand. Was killed while taking part in demonstrations against the Islamic regime in Lebanon neighbourhood of city of Isfahan on 25th Khordad. He was single and lived with his family and he was the sole bread winner in his family, taking care of his younger siblings.



43 – Jafar Berwaieh a lecturer at Chamran University in Ahvaz and a PhD student at University of Tehran was in Tehran at the time of Elections and took part in demonstrations against the Islamic regime. He was killed during one of these demonstrations on 28th June in 7 Tir while taking part in demonstrations in Baharestan Square. He was shot in the head. His body was identified by a friend and then taken to Ahvaz to his family. The security forces were present at the funeral service.

44 - Hamid Maddah Shorcheh.

Student, was arrested by the regime forces while taking part in a peaceful sitting as a way of protesting against the regime in the Gohar Shad mosque. He was tortured so badly that he died on the day he was finally released. His wake was on Sunday 5th July.

45- Maryam Mehr Azin, 24 years old, was shot dead in Azadi Street.

46 - Milad Yazdanpanah, 30 years old, was shot dead in Azadi Street.

47 - Hamed Besharati, 26 years old, was shot dead in Azadi Street.

48 – Babak Sepehr, 35-years-old, was shot dead in Azadi Street.

49 - Neda Assadi.

50 - Amir Kaviri. (the only detail received about Amir is that he had attended Tatbighi high school and had recently completed High school

51 - Farzad Hashti.

52 – Hanif haddad Zadeh, 20, a student at Elm-o-Sanat University, was killed due to injuries received in the head after being beaten by batons in the hands of the Islamic security forces.

53 - Mohammad, 12 years old, (requires verification).

54 - Muharram Chegini Qeshlaqi, 34 , son of Mirza Gholi. Buried in Behesht-e-Zahra block 256 row 146 Number 13

55 - Mohammad Hossein Feizi, 26 , son of Gholamreza. Buried in Behesht-e-Zahra block 257 row 31 Number 25

56 - Ramin Ramezani, 22 , son of Mehdi, was on a break from doing his compulsory military service and had travelled to Tehran. He was killed in the second week of the demonstrations against the regime.

It took his family a month to receive his body which was shot in three places. His family had to hold the funeral service for their son under heavy security forces' presence. He was buried in Behesht-e-Zahra Block 257 row 46 number 32.

57- Sohrab Aarabi, a 19-year-old, whose family was told by the authorities that he died of gunshot wounds to his heart, 26 days after he disappeared during a demonstration on



15th June.

58- Davood Sadri, a 27-year-old, was shot during the demonstration on the 15th of June. It has been reported that Iranian authorities



requested his family to pay US\$ 350 for the bullet that killed him and US\$ 6000 for delivering his body.

59- Arman estakhri, an 18-year-old from Shiraz, was beaten to death by the Baseeji in Abivardi in Shiraz. He was hidden in an old woman's house and he died on 13th July and was buried in shiraz on 14th July.

60- Saeid Ismaeili khan bin, a 23-year-old, was beaten to death by the Baseeji in Tehran.

61- Mehrdad Heydari, a journalist, was killed by security forces in Mashhad on 19th June. His body was found on the outskirts of the city of Mashhad. He had written some very critical reports and commentaries about the Ministry of Information and the Security Forces, in regards to the tortures and unjust

tactics being used on the youth.

62-Ali fathalian, killed in Tehran in front of Lolagar mosque. Resident of Tehran, Rudaki Street, Shokufeh (Khamseh) Street.

63- Taraneh Mousavi, was a young woman who was reportedly arrested at a protest rally close to the Ghoba mosque in Tehran on June 28th, 2009. It was alleged that for 22 days she was tortured and raped. It



was alleged that she was suffocated while in a coma and then the body was burnt to avoid autopsy. A friend told an Iranian blog that her burnt body was found in the desert near the road between Karaj and Ghazvin. She was reportedly in Karaj's Imam Khomeini hospital for a short while.

64- Hassan Kazemeini, a 19-year-old, whose grandfather wrote an open letter to the print media in Iran. The letter said: " My 19-year-old grandson went to demonstrations with other like-minded people to protest against the lack basic human rights. He was fronted by the regime's forces who claimed their peaceful gathering was unlawful . Hassan never returned home.

65- Mr. Moazez, a 27-year-old, was shot in the eye while taking part in protests against the Islamic regime on 20th June 2009 close to Azadi Square. He was killed as a result of this shot.

66-Mohammad Kamrani, According to the witnesses he died in a hospital on the 16th of July 3 hours after admission. He died of his wounds inflicted by torture. Even when he was



unconscious and half dead, Mohammad was tied to his hospital bed and died under heavy security.

67- Meysam Ebadi, a 17- year-old, was shot to death on his way home on Sadeghiye Square on 13th June. He was shot in the stomach on his way home from work. He worked in a shop that sold carpet.

68- Ramin Aghazade Ghahramani was arrested during one of the demonstrations in Tehran. He was brutally tortured in detention. He died 15 days after his release from detention. He told his family that he was hung from his feet for a period of his detention.



69- Mohsen Rouholamini, was arrested during demonstrations in Tehran on 9th July. His family had expected him to be freed as Iranian authorities promised them. But authorities, on 22nd July, informed Mohsen's family that he was dead. He was buried on 24th July.



70- Amir Javadifar, a 24-year-old student of industrial management in Qazvin (city), who was beaten during the protests, on 9th July, by the plain clothes hired mercenaries and was taken to the hospital. On his release from the hospital he was taken to Evin prison arrested in a demonstration on 9th July. According to the reports he was so badly beaten that on the face that he had lost his nose. He also had internal bleeding due to the injuries he received in prison. Amir Javadifar died in prison.



71- Yousef Salih, not much details is known about his death during the demonstrations in Tehran against

the regime. Relatives of other killed ones have confirmed his death. Nothing is known about Yousef's family.

72- Hassan Shapouri, a student, who was killed under torture in Kahrizak prison. This is according to one of the prisoners who had freed from Kahrizak.

73-Reza Fatahi, a student, who was killed under torture in Kahrizak prison. This is according to one of the prisoners who had freed from Kahrizak.

74- Milad Hosseini(son of Davood, please note that we are not 100% sure about the surname), According to a freed prisoner from Kahrizak prison. Milad was tortured and brutally assaulted by one of the torturers named Sadegh. on the first night as a result of which he was put in a coma from which he never woke up.

75-Morteza salahashoor, was killed under torture in Kahrizak prison. This is according to one of the prisoners who had freed from Kahrizak.

76- Morad Aghasi, was killed under torture in Kahrizak prison. This is according to one of the prisoners who had freed from Kahrizak.

77- Mohsen Entezami, was killed under torture in Kahrizak prison. This is according to one of the prisoners who had freed from Kahrizak.

78- Omidreza Mirsayafi, 29-year-old blogger died in Tehran's Evin prison on 18th March, Mirsayafi was prosecuted solely for his opinions expressed in his private blog. He was charged with insulting the authorities and sentenced to two years



and six months in prison. It has been reported that the initial stages of Mirsayafi's treatment inside the prison's medical clinic and reported that the prison doctors failed to provide proper care by not sending him immediately to a hospital to save his life.

79- Hamid Rezaei was shot dead in Shahin Shahr, Isfahan. The link below is a film of his dead body: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_wwudKa-NdQ

80- Shafeinejad was killed in demonstrations on 15th June in Isfahan.

81- Hossein Akbari, (16 years old, son of Davood) was arrested near Enqelab Square on 20th June. Despite all the searches his family was unable to find out what had happened to him was finally contacted by the authorities on 21st



July and asked to go to Imam Khomeini hospital to collect his corpse. Hossein's body showed signs of beating batons but the beating that he received to his head was the fatal one. He was buried on 26th July in Behesht Zahra, next to his mother.

82- Sajad Ghaed Rahmati, a 20-year-old (born on 21/03/1980, son of Namdar) from the small town of Dorood, Lorestan, like many, had come to Tehran in search of work during the summer. He took part in the demonstration accompanied by his cousin. His cousin was filming the protest rally when he heard that



someone had been killed near the Metro exist Navab. The filming stops as he approaches the body and recognises his cousin. The authorities demanded equivalent of

US\$4000 from the family to release the body to them. The money was raised with the help of many in their small town and the family was able to claim their beloved son's body. Sajad's family, fearing more persecution by the regime and their lack of knowledge about how to access internet, has kept quiet.

83- Mansoor Ghoojazadeh, from khoj was killed by the plain clothes hired mercenaries. According to one of his old schoolmates, his family had his funeral service Ali Abad mosque and kept the cause of death a secret from most as in small towns the regime's security forces' reign of terror is worse than the bigger cities.

84- Mostafa Kiarostami, 22 years old, married, was injured by the Baseej forces and their plainclothes



agents in front of Tehran University during Friday Prayer. The forces of suppression struck him so hard that he was unable to return home on his own. Mr. Kiarostami

contacted her mother for help. Once he reached home, his condition worsened and he was taken to Kasra Hospital in Tehran. However, he died the same evening from the extensive injuries he had suffered. His cause of death was reported as cerebral hemorrhage.

85- Pooya Maghsoud Beygi, a student of medical science in Kermanshah, was arrested and tortured by the security forces on 20th Jun and died after his release from prison.

86- Behzad Mohajer, 47 years old, went missing after participating in the protest held on Monday, June 15th. During the period he was missing, his family members pleaded with the Revolutionary courts, Evin Prison and judiciary



centers for information. However, officials refused to provide any clear indication on his whereabouts. After 47 days of uncertainty and subjecting family members to harassment, Behzad's lifeless body was shown to his sister.

According to Behzad's sister, the pictures showed that he had bullet wounds in the chest. The coroner's office only said that the body was delivered from Loghman Hospital on June 21st. Consequently, the family members do not have any information about the location and circumstances of his death.

87- Hamid Iraqi, 20 years old from Tehran, was shot in his heart in Azadi street on 20th Jun. His family had to pay the authorities US\$5000 to collect his body.

88- Cyrus Azizi, 21 years old from Kianshahr in south east of Tehran, was killed on 15th Jun. Authorities asked his family to pay \$3500 before releasing his body.

89- Alireza Tavassoli, 12 years old, he went with his father to Behesht-e-Zahra cemetery to participate in the ceremonies held for those killed by the regime on 28th July, in order to pay respect to them on the 40th day after their death. He was



killed as a result of severe beating by the security forces.

90- Ghassem Dehbozorgi, from Afifabad's Street-Tehran, was killed on 3th August. His death was reported by friends who were witness to it.

91- Masood Zare, from Amirkabir's

street, was killed on 3th August-Tehran. Friends who were witness to his death reported it.

92- Abbas Disna, 40 years old, was killed as a result of severe



beating by the regime's forces. He is buried in Behesht-e-Zahra cemetery block 257 - row 66 number 17.

93-Ibrahim Khezri, from Shariati Street- Tehran, was killed in 16 Azar Street - Tehran on 20th Jun.

94- Fatemeh Semsar Zadeh, was killed in a demonstration in Azadi Square on 15th Jun.

95-Mohammadreza Ameri, went missing during the demonstrations in Azadi's Street on 15th June. he has been reported dead.

96- Zahed Shokrabi, 20 years old, Bahaei, son of Dr. Mahmood Shokrabi, On July 21th (2009), his sister Arghavan, 19, and him left the house to meet their sick grandmother when they received a call from their father saying that their grandmother needs them. On their way, they encountered and got mixed with the street crowd who were protesting against the Islamic regime. They were arrested by the security forces. They were taken to Seyyed Ali khan prison. The prison forces started beating and torturing Zahed in front of his sister Arghavan. They ordered Arghavan to get naked or they would kill his brother. They get a knife out to cut his head. She started taking her clothes off, the torturers started raping her. Zahed was beaten up for protesting the rape. At one point the torturers half killed him by hanging him from a rope. Once he regained consciousness he started yelling again at those raping to his sister. They attacked him again and this time they beat him to death in front of his

sister.

97 – Alireza davoodi, 26, student from the resistance movement, was from Isfahan. He died in hospital on 29th July.



He was the editor of the Isfahan university student press “Rah-e Khaki”. He

was the organizer and/or speaker at many students’ assemblies namely 8th March 86, in Isfahan, 4th December 2007 in Isfahan, 1th May 2008 in Kamyaran and a leading organizer of workers’ protest in Isfahan. He was banned from studying at the university and on 12th February 2009 was arrested in shahin Shahr, Isfahan. He was freed on bail (Us\$100,000.00) on 25th April 2009. He died in hospital on 29th July 2009.

98 - Ali pour Kaveh, 19, was killed on 20th Jun in Tehran.

99- Mohsen Moradi, (unknown location and date of death)

100- Mohammad Asqari, He was responsible for the security of the IT



network in Iran's interior ministry. He was killed 16th Jun in a suspicious car accident in Tehran. Asgari had reportedly leaked evidence that the elections were rigged to alter the votes from the provinces.

101- Mohammad Javad Parandakh, 23, from Gilan Gharb-



Kermanshah province, student of petrochemical engineering at Sanati University in Isfahan, returned home after having taken part in student protest in Isfahan. On

his return he was summoned to present himself to the Intelligence Department and was freed on bail on US\$ 30,000.00 until his return to Isfahan, where he needed to present himself to the Intelligence Department there. Once back in Isfahan, he duly presented himself for interrogation. He was interrogated for two days and on the third day he was found dead by the police under one of the bridges in the city. The coroner stated the cause of death as having been hit in the head by a hard object. He was buried in his hometown on 27th August 2009.

102- Saeedeh Pour Aghaei (Amayi), daughter of Abbas Pour Aghaei/Amayi, was arrested by the



regime’s forces for chanting slogans against the regime from the rooftop of her house in Tehran. 20

days later, her body was identified by her mother but she was not allowed to bury her. Later, she was buried without her family’s knowledge. She has been buried in Behesht-e-Zahra block 302.

103- Mahmoud Nafissi Najafi, a worker, who was assaulted on 15th



Jun on his way back from work near Azadi Square. He told his family that he was assaulted badly and put inside a car that was carrying others,

some of who appeared dead and others injured. He became unconscious then but later when he became conscious again, he pleaded with the security forces and one of them threw him out of the car. On his return home, his family was fearful of further persecution by the

regime and decided to look after him at home. 10 days later when his condition worsened they were forced to consult the doctors at one of the hospitals and that’s when they were told that he had a bullet inside him and that he needed to be admitted to the hospital but he died before being admitted. Being afraid of the regime’s forces they kept the cause of death a secret and buried him in Behesht-e-Zahra.

104- Gholamreza Moghimi, 48 years old, born in 1961. He was arrested at 18 Tir (9 July 2009) and was transferred to Nedamatgah Markazi Karaj a jail in Karaj a city near Tehran and under the torture, and after 15 days his body was transferred to family in Loghman hospital Tehran. He was killed as a result of the tortures. He buried in No 30- row 116-block 302- Behesht-e Zahra, Tehran.

105- Ahmad Kargar Nejati was killed as a result of severe physical assault by the Islamic regime’s forces and died in a hospital. He is buried in block 213 row 15 number 35.

106- Hadi Fallah Manesh, 29, owner of a small business was killed in Tehran and is buried in Behesht-e-Zahra cemetery, block 53.

107- Mohammad Naderi Pour, an engineering student at Omran Faculty of University of Bahona- Kerman, was kidnapped as he left university on 1th July, at 7pm.



48 hours later, his dead body was found inside his car in the city of Sirjan. The coroner stated the cause of death as being hit at the back of the head with a hard object.

108- Majid Kamali, 24, from the Imam neighbourhood in Yazd, was arrested at 6 am on 25th August by

the security forces and so badly tortured that he died under the brutal 8-hour torture . At 2 pm his body was taken to Afshar Yazr hospital but the hospital refused to receive the corpse .

109- Mr. Esmaeeli, from Khanbebin, whose family was not allowed to hold a wake for him.

1110- Dr. Maghsoud Lou(male), from Sorkhankalateh, whose family was not allowed to hold a wake for him.

111- Dr Rahimi(female), from Gorgan, whose family was not allowed to hold a wake for her.

112- Saeed karimi- was killed in Qom by the Islamic regime's forces during the demonstrations. He was buried in his hometown, Abarjas Village- Qom.

113- Hossein A.

114- Ali Shahnazar, 41, was arrested on Qods protests against the IRI. His body was returned to his family 3 days later. Details of how

he was killed is not clear yet. Ali used to reside in France and had recently moved back to Iran.

115- Amir-Mehdi Hamzeh-Louie, He was beaten to death by plain-clothes agents. These forces who had a van and a 206 Peju automobile arrested this young man along with two of his friends near the Qeitarieh Park in Tehran and detained them in the van. One of the young men could use his cell phone to call his father and inform him of his arrest. These young men also asked their captors who had introduced themselves as police forces, to see their ID which led to agents' severe response. "These kids have gotten so cheeky that they ask for our ID!" the detainers said, and violently beat the young men to the extent that Amir-Mehdi suddenly became unconscious as a result of the beatings by the men who were equipped with walkie talkie and other police equipment. The agents became agitated and threw these three boys out of the van to quickly

leave the scene. They were so nervous that they ran over Amir-Mehdi's leg, while he was lying unconscious on the ground. Amir-Mehdi passed away on the way to the Shohada Hospital.

116- Hesam Hanifeh, 19 years old, Regime's forces were shooting him to death in Azady square on 15th Jun. Family Hnifeh the bodies were received the body of Hesam after a few days searching on him and contacting by security forces. He buried in the Karaj. Family hasn't informed public on this event because of threats from security forces.
